REVISED POLICY FOR ASSESSMENT

As per revised formula securing passing marks in assignments/practical and other components is not compulsory w.e.f. Spring, 2023 onwards, however, passing marks i.e. 40% in final exams will be mandatory. If a student gets 40 marks out of 100 in the final exams and does not score 50% aggregate marks, he/she will be declared Fail in the respective course and he/she will have to re-register/re-admit in the respective course, whenever said course (s) are offered in any of the subsequent semester (s).

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ALLAMA IQBAL OPEN UNIVERSITY

Allama Iqbal Open University, a mega university was established in 1974 under an Act of Parliament. The main campus of the university is situated in sector H-8, Islamabad. It was the second open university of the world and the first of its kind in Asia and Africa. The aim of establishing AIOU was to provide affordable and accessible education through distance learning at the door-steps to those people who could not continue their education journey through formal system of education. The University (AIOU) operates on semester system and admits students in Autumn and Spring semesters. Under graduate admissions are offered in both the semesters where-as post graduates are offered once a year. The enrolled students are given course books specially prepared by the university on self-instructional principles. However, at post graduate level reprints of foreign books alongwith allied material and university prepared study guides help students to polish their skills.

At present, the AIOU is offering programmes from Matric to PhD level in diverse disciplines comprised of four faculties. The university has established study centres across the country where distance education students are provided necessary guidance by their respective tutors, moreover, the university has established full-time study centres wherein the students of MBA (IT), MBA (Banking and Finance), MBA (Marketing), MBA (HRM), BS (CS), MSc/BS Chemistry, MSc/BS Microbiology etc. are being provided instruction, guidance and counselling through face-to-face education. AIOU is also offering four years' under-graduate degrees.

Apart from curricular and extra-curricular activities during the academic year, the AIOU and its regional centres actively participate in the co-curricular activities by arranging educational and literary seminars, workshops and conferences, attended not only by the students and faculties of the university but also by the renowned dignitaries and scholars. For the science students and the research scholars, a science complex has been built where they use the latest equipment of international standard for experiments and research. To meet the present day challenges, internet facility is also available in the student hostel and the Central Library where computers have been provided to enable students to access latest information available through open source databases.

FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HUMANITIES

First established in 1981 with five departments, the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities has, over the years, flourished to become, by far, the largest Faculty of the University. It consists of 14 departments offering masters programmes in major areas of Social Sciences and Humanities like, Business Administration, Economics, Mass Communication, Sociology, Urdu, Library & Information Sciences, History, Pakistan Studies and Teaching of English as a foreign Language (TEFL). Additionally, efforts are afoot to plan and launch post-graduate programmes in Pakistani Languages and Law.

The Commonwealth-collaborated master's programmes in the areas of Business and Public Administration, which are specially tailored for the modern day busy executives, were launched in Spring 2002 semester.

In tune with the government's policy of promoting and strengthening a culture of higher education and research in the country, the AIOU's Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities has shown a lot of dynamism over the past few years. It has launched MPhil/PhD programmes in Iqbaliat, Urdu and Mass Communication and History while preparations are being made to launch MPhil Business Administration, Applied Linguistics.

The Faculty of Social Sciences & Humanities also offers several bachelors' level programmes in such professional areas like Bachelors in Library & Information Sciences (BLIS), BS-Business Administration, BS-Commerce and Mass communication. Tens of thousands of students comprising all demographic groups and, from all over the country, enroll, each year, in these bachelor's level programmes.

The Faculty has expanded vitally and its programmes have gained a high popularity as is clear from rapidly rising trend of enrolment during the past decade. During the period under report, the Faculty accorded high priority towards quality improvements and to modify its programmes in accordance with the current challenges of 21st century.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Introduction

The Department of English was established with the inception of Allama Iqbal Open University in 1974. Keeping in view the present dynamics of English language learning and teaching in Pakistan, the Department offers programmes with the following objectives:

**PGD-TEACHING OF ENGLISH
AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE (TEFL)**
(Programme Code: 1302)

The Diploma in Teaching of English as a Foreign Language (Dip TEFL) aims at creating awareness of the approaches, methods, and techniques of learning and teaching of English in the classroom. The Dip TEFL offers a range of courses which cover different aspects of English language teaching.

Eligibility

Candidates with the following qualification are eligible for admission:

- MA/BS (16 years' education/degree in English Language/ Linguistics/Literature)
- Admissions are awarded on the basis of merit, which is determined by the Department.

Medium of Instruction: English

Credit Hours Required: It is a 30 credit hour study programme.

Duration: One year (two semesters), including a workshop (compulsory) of 6 credit hours.

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DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

The Department of Commerce stands as a pioneer in academic excellence of AIOU with significant contributions to the educational landscape since its establishment in 1978, initially named as Industrial Education Department. The Department commenced its journey by offering Industrial & Commercial Training Courses. In 1986, the Department experienced a rebranding, emerging as the Department of Business & Management. Subsequently, in 1987, it was divided into two distinct departments: the Department of Business Management and the Department of Commerce.

In 1987, the Department of Commerce expanded its horizons, providing a comprehensive platform with the initiation of I. Com and B. Com programs. The team diligently worked to enhance the programs, setting the stage for the Department's

future accomplishments. A significant turning point occurred in 2004 focusing on further elevating the quality of academic programs. The team dedicated themselves to the continuous improvement and up-gradation of the department's offerings. In 2011, the introduction of M. Com programs with a specialization in Accounting & Finance through approved study centers marked a notable achievement. In 2013, the Department obtained the NOC from the Higher Education Commission (HEC) to launch an Associate Degree in Commerce in a blended mode of learning, featuring eight specializations. In 2017, recognizing a gap in financial reporting skills among Commerce graduates, the Department introduced courses on financial reporting in the schemes of M. Com and BS Accounting & Finance. The commitment to academic excellence led to the offering of BS Accounting & Finance in blended mode in the same year.

In 2021, the Department embarked on the development of MS Commerce postgraduate programs catering to the needs of ICMA, CA, and M. Com students keen on advancing their education and engaging in research work. The accomplishment of these efforts materialized in Spring 2023, with the successful launch of the MS Commerce program after obtaining the NOC from HEC.

In 2023, the Department achieved a major milestone with the accreditation of its BS Accounting & Finance program by ACCA—the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants—a world-renowned professional accountancy body recognized by the Higher Education Commission (HEC). This accomplishment reflects the Department's unwavering commitment to global academic and professional standards.

Building on this progress, in 2025 the Department identified the growing importance of e-commerce, data analytics, block chain technologies, and other IT-driven tools in the field of commerce. To meet these emerging needs and in line with the HEC Undergraduate Education Policy, the Department developed the BS E-Commerce and associate degree in E-Commerce programs. These programs have been duly approved by all statutory bodies and are scheduled to be offered from Spring 2026.

Since its inception, the Department of Commerce has played a pivotal role in producing thousands of business graduates, who, in various capacities, contribute to the nation's workforce. Upholding the vision of the University, the Department remains dedicated to developing skill oriented and professional courses in consultation with accreditation bodies and stakeholders.

PGD-INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS (IFRS)

(Program Code: 1060)

Program Introduction:

The field of accounting has undergone significant changes in the last two decades with the development of new standards and revision of existing financial reporting frameworks. The IFRSs are adopted by companies around the globe to make their financial statement comparable across various jurisdictions. The objective of this PGD in IFRS is to enable students to understand the requirements of International Accounting Standards/International Financial Reporting Standards for the preparation of financial statements and improve the quality of financial reporting in corporate sector.

Program Objectives

The Postgraduate Diploma in International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) aims to:

- i. Develop a comprehensive understanding of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) and International Accounting Standards (IASs).
- ii. Equip learners with the knowledge and skills required for the preparation and presentation of financial statements in accordance with IFRS requirements.
- iii. Enhance the ability to interpret, analyze, and apply financial reporting standards in diverse business and regulatory environments.

- iv. Develop professional competencies in financial reporting, financial statement analysis, auditing, and corporate reporting.
- v. Enable participants to address emerging accounting and reporting challenges in local and international business environments.
- vi. Prepare graduates for professional growth and advanced studies in accounting, auditing, finance, and related disciplines.

Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs)

Upon successful completion of the PGD in International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), graduates will be able to:

- i. PLO-1: IFRS Knowledge
Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) and International Accounting Standards (IASs).
- ii. PLO-2: Financial Reporting Competence
Prepare and present financial statements in accordance with applicable IFRS requirements.
- iii. PLO-3: Application of Standards
Apply relevant accounting standards to recognize, measure, present, and disclose financial information.
- iv. PLO-4: Financial Statement Analysis
Analyze and interpret financial statements for decision-making, performance evaluation, and stakeholder reporting.
- v. PLO-5: Professional Judgment
Exercise professional judgment in resolving complex accounting and financial reporting issues.

- vi. PLO-6: Auditing and Compliance
Evaluate financial reporting practices for compliance with regulatory, governance, and auditing requirements.

Career Options:

Graduates of the PGD in IFRS will be well-positioned for careers in financial reporting, accounting, auditing, compliance, and corporate finance. The qualification enhances opportunities in multinational corporations, audit firms, financial institutions, regulatory bodies, and public sector organizations. Graduates may work as Financial Reporting Specialists, IFRS Consultants, Accountants, Internal Auditors, Financial Analysts, and Compliance Officers. The diploma also supports career progression for professionals pursuing ACCA, CA, CMA, CPA, and other accounting certifications. Furthermore, it provides a strong foundation for advanced studies and specialized roles in international accounting and corporate reporting.

Admission Eligibility:

Minimum 14 years of education in commerce/business or management sciences (B.Com/Associate Degree/BBA or equivalent) 2nd division. Persons with higher education commerce and business subjects such as BS Accounting and Finance, B. Com Hons, BBA Hons., BS Business Studies, M.Sc Accounting and Finance, MPA, M. Com, M.Sc Public Administration, CMA, ACCA, PIPFA, CA MBA, MS

Commerce, MS Management Sciences, etc. is also eligible for admissions.

ODL Mode of education will be adopted. Study material will be provided in the form of e-books and the workshop classes will be conducted in online mode through LMS in English language.

Introduction:

The Department has assembled outstanding teaching faculty and developed extensive teaching material for the improvement of education in Pakistan. The Department is offering programs from BBA to PhD levels with various specializations. These programs contribute significantly to the national goals by developing the professionals equipped with modern business techniques. This program provides a comprehensive understanding of contemporary human resource practices, including recruitment and selection, training and development, compensation management, performance management, labor relations, and strategic human resource management. The curriculum integrates theoretical concepts with practical applications to prepare participants for the challenges of a dynamic and competitive business environment.

The PGD-HRM aims to develop competent HR professionals who can contribute to organizational growth through effective workforce planning, employee engagement, talent management, and strategic decision-making. Through a combination of business fundamentals, management principles, communication skills, and specialized HR courses, participants gain the expertise necessary to pursue careers in human resource management and advance into leadership roles.

Objectives:

The objectives of Post Graduate Diploma in HRM are:

1. To inculcate the concepts and practices essential to Human Resource Management,
2. To prepare our graduates for HRM positions,
3. To develop HR professionals to advance their careers.

Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs)

Upon successful completion of the Post Graduate Diploma in Human Resource Management (PGD-HRM), graduates will be able to:

1. Apply fundamental and advanced concepts, theories, and practices of Human Resource Management in organizational settings.
2. Identify, evaluate, and resolve human resource and organizational challenges using appropriate analytical and problem-solving techniques.
3. Design and implement recruitment, selection, training, development, and retention strategies to support organizational goals.
4. Develop and manage compensation, benefits, and performance management systems that promote employee motivation and organizational effectiveness.
5. Interpret and apply labor laws, employment regulations, and industrial relations practices while ensuring legal and ethical compliance.

Eligibility:

Applicants having 14 years of education (BA/BSc/BCom/BBA/Associate Degree Programmes 2-years) from HEC recognized institution with at least second division (45% marks) would be eligible to apply.

Mode of Study:

- i. The Post Graduate Diploma in Human Resource Management would be offered through ODL mode.
- ii. The course outlines along with the required reading materials and assignments will be provided to the students on AIOU website.
- iii. Workshop will be conducted as per university policy.

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DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATIONAL PLANNING, POLICY STUDIES AND LEADERSHIP (EPPSL)

The department was established in 1976 was renamed EPPSL in 2008. The department of EPPSL offers programmes in educational planning, leadership and management. These programmes are aimed at producing graduates as professionals for the cadre of various management positions in the government and non-government educational institutions and organizations. Programmes of EPPSL include B.Ed (4-years) with specialization in School Leadership and Management; Specialization of Leadership and Management in B.Ed (1.5 years); two Postgraduate Diploma programs in ELM & EPM, MPhil EPM & ELM and, PhD- EPM. The courses of these programmes are attained to the field requirements of target personnel in the areas of educational planning and management.

PGD-EDUCATIONAL PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT (EPM) (Programme Code: 1500)

GENERAL INFORMATION

- i. The certificates/degrees of AIOU are equivalent to any other recognized Board/University.
- ii. A candidate is required to apply for admission (LMS) online only.
- iii. If an applicant does not receive any information regarding admission within three months from submission of application, he/she should presume no admission.
- iv. A course taken by any student cannot be changed during the semester. However, in real hardship cases, the change in courses will be allowed before the start of study period after deposit of prescribed fee. Study period schedule is available on AIOU website.
- v. The address of a student will not be changed during the semester.
- vi. On payment of the registration fee, each student will be issued a student ID. This number must be quoted in all the future correspondence along with the roll number, course(s), code numbers and semester.
- vii. Study material shall be available at the LMS and Website at their given addresses.
- viii. After confirmation of admission students are usually intimated about the part time tutors for each course through student CMS portal. If you do not found information about tutors, you are required to contact the concerned AIOU Regional Office immediately without any delay.
- ix. Rules and regulations framed, enhanced and changed from time to time by the authorities, bodies of the university will be effective as deemed necessary. The student will have to abide by all such rules and regulations from the date of their implementation.
- x. A student who fails in continuous assessment component is not eligible to reappear but will be allowed to re-register for the same course at its next offering semester by the university.

REGULATIONS FOR REFUND OF ADMISSION FEE

- (i) The Applicant/candidate/student who have submitted his/her fee for Admissions but do not wish to continue and applied for refund of fee before the start of his/her study period as per Academic Calendar available on the AIOU website corresponding to his/her respective semester i.e Autumn or Spring, the fees will be refunded after the deduction @ 10% of the total fee.
- (ii) The Applicant/Candidate who was not eligible but deposited the fee for admission and applied for refund within one year from the date of fee deposit, the fee shall be refunded after deduction @15% of total fee.
- (iii) The student who has deposited his/her fee in excess of due fee that total excess amount shall be refunded or adjusted as the case may be.
- (iv) The Treasurer Department shall verify the fee of students and shall send the case to the Audit Department for pre-audit.
- (v) The cheque will be issued to the candidate by the Campus Payment Section (CPS), Treasurer's Department.
- (vi) In the case of death, the full fee will be refunded through crossed cheque in favour of the Blood Relative of deceased student, after fulfilling all the codal formalities. The refund case must be submitted

within one year of fee deposit.

- (vii) In case the students who are not allowed/granted admission to a program offered by the University due to less enrollment/non formation of viable group/non offering of courses, full fee will be refunded to them.
- (viii) If the admission of an Applicant/Candidate is not matured due to any reason beyond the control of the University or due to unforeseen issues, the whole paid fee, without any deductions shall be refunded to the respective applicant/candidate. The refund case must be submitted within one year of fee deposit.
